

Cuba condemns attack on Iran as a violation of international law

Cuba's Foreign Minister Bruno Rodríguez Parrilla has strongly condemned the joint attacks by Israel and the US on Iran, describing them as a violation of the country's national sovereignty and territorial integrity.

According to the Cuban chief diplomat, the attacks that began on Saturday, “have broken the peace and international security” and constitute “a clear violation of international law and the UN Charter,” Rodríguez [said](#) in a statement on his official X account. Cuba's foreign minister called on the international community to mobilize against “the underhanded aggression” against Iran and to stop the attacks immediately.

“This is already the second time that such attacks have taken place during ongoing talks on the nuclear issue,” Rodríguez said. Cuba reaffirmed its long-standing foreign policy stance: support for multilateralism, peaceful conflict resolution, and full respect for the sovereignty of all peoples.

Cuba [already took a stand](#) on the attacks on Iran last June. “The aggressive policies of the State of Israel and its reprehensible and irresponsible actions are only possible thanks to the military, financial, logistical, and political support provided by the United States government, which further jeopardizes regional and international stability and security, with unforeseeable consequences for humanity,” the statement released at the time said.

Update (March 2): In a [more detailed statement](#) from the ministry, Cuba joined “international calls to immediately end this aggression, which has claimed an unknown number of civilian

casualties, including children.” An escalation “driven by well-known hegemonic interests and declared intentions of domination through the use of military force” must be prevented.

Cuba also called for “preserving the principle of good neighborliness between Iran and the Arab states during this delicate phase.” “Strict adherence to the principles of international law and the Charter of the United Nations must take precedence, in particular the sovereign equality of states, non-interference in their internal affairs, the prohibition of the threat or use of force against the territorial integrity or political independence of a state, and the peaceful settlement of disputes,” the statement said. On Sunday, Cuban President Miguel Díaz-Canel also [condemned](#) the killing of Iranian spiritual leader Ali Khamenei, which he described as “an unscrupulous violation of all norms of international law and human dignity.” ([Cubaheute](#))
